**Draft of Proposed changes to AZSSAR Constitution and Bylaws**

Presented for first look at Annual Meeting, 2/22/14, To Be Voted on at Annual Meeting 4/19/14  
Copy sent to AZSSAR Chancellor 2/20/14 for review and input. AZSSAR Chancellor has returned his comments and concurs with the proposed draft. The draft was then presented to the members present at the Annual Meeting on 2/22/14. There were no recommended changes or additions. It is therefore being sent to all AZSSAR Members through the SAR-inzone distribution for review prior to presentation at the Board of Managers Meeting April 19, 2014 where it will be presented for a vote to adopt the proposed changes. This will require a 3/4 vote of the delegates present at the meeting.

Page 1-2 Constitution – no changes
